#### **RESOLUTION 2020-069**

WHEREAS, Pump Springs Baptist Church owns a tract of land consisting of approximately 0,32 acres with building, and;

WHEREAS, the building was constructed as a transitional facility to aid prisoners as they transitioned back into society, and;

WHEREAS, the church has made the decision to sell the property for the sum of One Hundred Seventy Five Thousand (\$175,000,00) Dollars, and;

WHEREAS, the Claiborne County Commission has previously allocated the sum of Seven Hundred Forty Six Thousand Two Hundred Sixty One (\$746,261.00) Dollars for work on Gap Creek Road pursuant to Resolution 2020-038, and;

WHEREAS, there will remain approximately One Hundred Eighty Nine Thousand Five Hundred Sixty Two (\$189,562.00) Dollars in the Grant, and;

WHEREAS, the Helen Ross McNabb is willing to establish a jail to work program similar to one operated in Hamblen County, Tennessee, and;

WHEREAS, inmates will receive drug and alcohol therapy while residing in a halfway house, receive employment, and extensive therapy.

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED, upon amendment, by the Claiborne County Commission meeting in regular session on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2020, that Joe Brooks, Claiborne County Mayor and the Claiborne County Finance Department is authorized to set aside the sum of One Hundred Seventy Five Thousand (\$175,000.00) Dollars in the budget for the purchase of the property and building owned by Pump Springs Baptist Church on Straight Creek Road, adjacent to the Claiborne County Justice Center.
